Role of a Police Officer

As a police officer, your primary duty is to maintain order and ensure the class runs smoothly according to the rules.

You will monitor students for violations, gather evidence, and report any infractions to the President. You also work closely with the Lawyer to ensure that punishments are fair and in line with the Laws.

Key Responsibilities

Monitoring for Violations

Keep an eye on potential rule-breaking, such as Zenny forgery or unauthorized use of real money.

Maintaining Fairness

Ensure that all transactions, especially during Bank open hours, are conducted fairly and legally.

Evidence Collection

Gather concrete proof (such as witnesses or documents) to support claims of rule violations.

Reporting

Submit reports on violations to the President for further action.

Collaborating with Lawyers

Ensure that all punishment is based on clear evidence, working with the Lawyer to confirm the facts.



Laws and Violations

These are some of the laws and violation that you may need to watch for:

Forgery of Zenny, Tickets, or Permits

Any falsification of currency or tickets is illegal and must be reported.

Use of Real Money

Real-world currency is not allowed. Any use must be stopped, and violators reported.

Unfair Transactions

If students are coercing others or participating in unfair trades, you need to intervene.

Failure to Pay Debts

Monitor students for compliance with debt repayments, especially if they are being pursued by Debt Collectors.

Others

You need to update on the laws applied in the future.



Policing Concepts

These are some policing principles that you must use as a police:

Rule of Law

Ensure that everyone in the class, regardless of their status, follows the same rules. You must enforce these laws impartially.

Chain of Evidence

Proper collection and preservation of evidence are crucial. You must make sure that any evidence you collect, such as witness statements or forged Zenny, is reliable and unaltered.

Use of Discretion

Like real police, you will sometimes have to use discretion when deciding whether to pursue minor rule violations or when to intervene.

Community Policing

Build a relationship with your classmates so they trust you to maintain order and report violations.

Collaboration with Judicial Process

Police work with the Lawyer to ensure fair treatment and accurate facts during trials.
